- You can reserve a King Suite with a King size bed or a Queen Suite with two Queen sized beds these are one room suites. Their cost including taxes is \$166.50 per night and includes breakfast. They also have 2 room suites in King or Queen for \$216.15. The cut off date for our room block and prices is Sunday August 16th so PLEASE book early as I only have 30 rooms blocked off but I can possibly get more if we fill up early.

The hotel has no Bar or restaurant, but we can bring in food and drinks. We will be only about a mile from downtown and there are many fine restaurants in the downtown area.

Third platoon's quest for fresh meat

Keep in mind this little adventure started out in the early days of 1969. I was just beyond of my FNG stage at any rate.

The location was somewhere west of LZ Nancy or LZ Sharon or ????? in the hill country. As I recall we had been conducting some operation close to one of the small villages in that area. After getting our routine four hours of actual sleep, we arose in the morning to a clear and beautiful day. After consuming our first-class breakfast of ham and eggs chopped, combined with the spaghetti, spiced with copious quantities of Tabasco sauce. Then proceeding somewhere on the outskirts of the perimeter for daily constitutional, we received our marching instructions for the day. As with most days I had absolutely no clue where we were going or what we were going to do when we got there. At the time I believe the right gunner on Sgt. Sachs track 33, "Stella," seems I stayed on that track for the duration. We started up all the ACAVs and Tanks, off we went roaming over hill and dale. The sky was clear, the sun was just gaining a bit of altitude to the east, and the temperature was pleasant, a beautiful day indeed. We had probably been on the march for somewhere around an hour, when somebody shouted, "hey look over on the next hill" I think it was Logsdon. There standing in the stateliest manner was a beautiful specimen of East Asian Samba Deer. (yes, I looked it up) the cry immediately went out "fresh meat" and the firing began. I don't know but it seems like Sgt. Sach may have been the first man to cut loose with his 50, then it really got going, 60's, M-16s however none of the tankers took a shot with a main gun, to this day I've never understood that. A canister round would've done the job perfectly. Instant hamburger we wouldn't have had to clean the animal. Of course, the deer took off lickety-split, maybe the fastest it had ever run. We made a valiant attempt to chase down the animal. Let your imagination run wild as to what an absolute cluster that must've been.

Well the result was one of the most amazing experiences in my life, someone please explain to me, how probably 1,000 projectiles can fly through the air a 1/4 mile away, at a target the size of a small horse, and not hit it!

I can't recall if it was only the third platoon or involved multiple platoons of A Troop, no matter, this was A Troops modus operandi in the early days. If it walks, talks, leaps, or creeps shoot it.

Remember, I'm almost 80, by the way my memory was not the first thing to go ????
